


TODAY WE HAVE SO MUCH KNOWLEDGE AT OUR FINGERTIPS












Application Our expanding knowledge of the universe can remind us of the vastness of God's creation and His infinite wisdom. As we explore the physical universe, we should also strive to explore the depths of God's word and His purposes for our lives.









Application Just as smartphones keep us connected and informed, we should remain connected to God's word and the community of believers. Utilizing modern technology, we can study the Bible, join online worship services, and stay in touch with our faith community no matter where we are



- In response to Gods work/promises that we already have Peter lists a number of character traits that believers should strive to develop.
- Goodness = excellence that whatever you do, applying your faith in such a way that it works in your daily life.
- Knowledge = more than intellectual understanding; it involves a deep, practical, lived out relational understanding of God's will and His character.



- "knowledge" = "full knowledge" or "knowledge that is growing."

 The word used here suggests practical knowledge or discernment.

 It refers to the ability to handle life successfully.
- No separation of heart and the mind, our character and knowledge
 - knowledge that is active, transformational leading to a fruitful Christian life. (v8 "keep you from being ineffective & productive")
- Opposite of being "so heavenly minded as to be of no earthly good!" This kind of knowledge does not come automatically it comes from obedience to the will of God (John 7:17).



- Gods desire for us to grow in knowledge and Peter is aware of the context of the society and culture
- Elements of false teaching influencing believers and leading believers astray.
- WE DON'T LIVE IN A VACUUM
- Here are the key false teachings Peter has to combat in his culture:



1. Denial of Jesus' Second Coming: 2 Peter 3:3-4:

- Issue: Some false teachers were denying the return of Jesus, suggesting that the promise of His second coming was not true or relevant to their lives.

2. Immoral Living: 2 Peter 2:1-2, 2 Peter 2:18-19

- Issue: These false teachers promoted a lifestyle of immoral living and indulgence in sinful desires, leading others into similar behaviour and discrediting the Christian faith.



3. Greed and Exploitation: 2 Peter 2:3

- Issue: False teachers were motivated by greed, exploiting believers for personal gain through deceit and manipulation.

4. Twisting of Scripture: 2 Peter 3:16

- Issue: They distorted and misinterpreted the Scriptures, leading people away from the true, historic teachings of the faith.

HOW DO WE GROW IN OUR KNOWLEDGE?



GROWTH IN KNOWLEDGE <u>BEGINS WITH DESIRE</u> 2 Peter 1:4 "evil desires"

DESIRE = a passion built on strong feelings (urges). These can be positive or negative, depending on whether the desire is inspired by faith

- James 1:13-15
- 1 Peter 2:2

GROWTH IN KNOWLEDGE <u>BEGINS WITH DESIRE</u> AND <u>CONTINUES WITH DETERMINATION</u>

- "EFFORT" Greek word "speudo" "move quickly, speed on" –to show zealous commitment to your best, it's a full effort by responding quickly. (earnest, diligent, quickly)
- For the believer, means quickly obeying what the Lord reveals is His priority.

Why is this important? Hosea 4:6
